



3. Hope activities.

Mark Timlin discussed the main activities that have occurred in the region.

Main discussion on:-

Being a global organisation serving 1.5 million people annually worldwide.

Please encourage Hope reps as they are volunteering, often on their own in each state/country. Mark listed names of all Hope reps.

Reviewed Hope Aus service to the poor since the last AGM. (see slides for more information)

Did a Global Network overview.

Also mentioned the program in Sydney which is assisting the lower socio-economic people by making and serving meals to the underprivileged in the local area.

Discussed the PNG Health and Education programs. Showed slides of the 9 mile clinic and discussed challenges that the volunteers would have with that particular project. (distance to location is an example)

Mentioned that 65,000 people have been impacted by the PNG Hope projects.

Mark also discussed the impact the projects in Fiji have had on the locals. For example, job creation, people have been able to stay in these new jobs, people saved from starvation with food vouchers.

A brief overview of Afghanistan projects was also discussed.

Rachel Beanland gave an overview of the Nepal project in 2021.

Nepal project for 2022 also mentioned.

Hope day of Giving 2022 mentioned.

Hoping to get a good donation total for the Hope Day of Giving 2023. Donations are down, possibly due to inflation, covid lockdowns and job losses.



In Education Program, we are focusing on schools that are in marginalized communities. Schools that are not well recognized but their interest and heart is in the learning and wellbeing of the children.





2022 – HOPE AUSTRALIA - CHRISTMAS HAMPERS & FOOD VOUCHURES

We are grateful to our family of disciples in Sydney,
Gold Coast and Melbourne for their generosity in
providing funding for Christmas Hampers that were
distributed to our local communities between
December 2022 and January 2023. In total we received
funding of FJ\$4,246.98. We purchased 65 food vouchers
to the value of FJ\$65 each which were distributed to
families living in informal settlements around Suva,
Nadi & Lautoka. Many of these families live below the
poverty line and these food vouchers were a big help
for them. Here is a breakdown of the areas in the
community where the families that were supported by
this project live. Disciples travelled to these locations to distribute
these food vouchers and met these families along the way.

2022 HOPE SPA YOUTH CORPS

The 2022 HOPE Spa Youth Corp had a total of 10 participants with 4 from Australia 4 from NZ and one from Fiji. This was a 10 day program from 18 to 28 November. The main focus of the program was on Mental Health & Wellness. HOPE Fiji partnered with a local NGO Mending Minds who facilitated the workshops in our local communities. Together with the HYC participants they visited the villagers and communities in Lovu, Tomuka & Tavakubu.

The areas of discussions and support provided to these communities covered topics on common mental health issues, suicide prevention, coping and self-care plans. There were also discussions on Child Development & Parenting challenges faced by many families in these communities.

After 5 days in the Western Region, the HYC Team moved to Suva where they spent 4 days encouraging the small but growing group of disciples, sharing their faith and getting into some bible studies with Locals at The University of the South pacific . It was an encouraging & a faith building time for many of the local disciples especially as our borders had only been re-open 11 months prior and to have participants from our NZ & Australia Churches visit after 2 years of Covid lockdown.
