Health Program

What started as a mobile caravan in 1994 at 9-mile, Port Moresby, evolved to an urban clinic and 4 other health facilities followed: 1 at 6 mile and 3 others in the central highlands. HOPE worldwide PNG manages these 5 clinics in partnership with the National Department of Health (NDoH), Christian Health Services (CHS), National Capital Provincial Health Authority (NCDPHA), and Simbu Provincial Health Authority (SiPHA).



The 9 mile and Lawes Road clinics are two of the busiest clinics in the National Capital District with daily attendances of between 200 to 300 patients. The clinics provide integrated medical services, which include outpatients, antenatal, nutrition for malnourished children, infant preventative health, family planning, Leprosy treatment, TB and HIV/STI counselling, testing and treatment.

Highlands Program



Moroma Sub Health Centre is in Kerowhagi District, which is situated on the border of two provinces: Simbu and Jiwaka and provides vital primary health services to the people of both provinces, a total of 8,000 people. The clinic was established in 2016 and renovated by volunteers in 2024 as part of a HOPE Volunteer Corps.



The Bokolma Aid Post is in remote Gumine District of Simbu Province, and is seen as a beacon of hope, providing essential health care to the rural villages, serving a population of approximately 5, 000 people.



The Kalewera Aid Post is in remote Kunai village bordering two districts: Gumine and Salt Nomane

Karamui, and provides primary health care to over 10,000 people from both districts.

TB/HIV Program



HOPE worldwide PNG continues to implement Global Fund TB-HIV Programs. In 2024 we reach NCD, Central, Simbu and Eastern Highlands provinces. One of our highlights for the cost extension implementation for the year 2024 was the MOU Signing with EHP-PHA.

In 2025, HOPE worldwide PNG is again a Sub-Recipient of Global Fund Grant Cycle 7 to implement in 3 districts of NCD this will save the lives of 1000s of people.

Direct Relief Medical Supplies

HOPE Global and Direct Relief International continue to support HOPEww PNG with essential medical supplies. In 2024 they supplied medicines for cancer patients in Port Moresby General Hospital- this medication is otherwise not available in-country. In 2025 donations reached over 2 million US dollars. This included medicines, personal protection equipment against infection that reached rural hospitals in PNG.

Parenting for Child Development (P4CD) Program



Support parents/caregivers of children aged 3-10years with Positive Parenting sessions throughout the settlements in Port Moresby city. The churches including Port Moresby International Church of Christ members are trained facilitators, delivering impactful parenting sessions with parents. From 2023 -2024, the program has reached 236 parents and impacted 599 children.

Clean Water Project

Most villages in Angoram District, especially Marienburg Local Level Government (LLG), including other parts of East Sepik Province are now able to access clean and safe drinking water. The CWP in East Sepik Province was funded by the provincial government since 2022. Communities in Brown River, Central Province; especially mothers and children are also beneficiaries to this vital project funded by the US government (USAID).
