SUPPORTING UKRANIAN FAMILIES



The ongoing conflict in Ukraine has left tens of thousands dead or injured, and displacing more than 10 million people from their homes. Nearly half of which have fled to neighbouring countries--mainly women and children, leaving the men in the family to stay and fight.

HOPE worldwide is partnering with other charities, the UN and the European Churches of Christ to meet local needs since the onset of the conflict in late February 2022. The incredible generosity and compassion shown by the hundreds of HOPE volunteers across Europe have helped thousands of traumatised Ukranian families. So far, assistance provided includes:

- Delivery of \$20 million USD worth of donated lifesaving medical supplies;
- Food and water in the form of 1,000 meals delivered per day and over 2,000 water filters supplied;
- Psychological support to Ukrainian families;
- Housing for over 1,000 refugees across 31 cities in Europe; and
- Refugee Hotel in Modova providing a safe place to stay, emotional support, as well as food. So far a total of 10,407 hot meals provided.

Thank you all for your generous hearts. We have raised over \$20,000 AUD in donations via the HOPE worldwide Australia website and bank transfer.
